Concept:

In this unit students will look at exploring the internet for research purposes. They will look at how to use different search engines appropriately and effectively and discuss the types of information found online. Some will be able to decide which information is reliable. Students will revise the SMART internet safety rules in order to use the internet safely. Most students will know what to do if they see something online that makes them feel uncomfortable or worried and know who to report this to.

Knowledge:

- Know how to get on to the internet.
- Know what a search engine is.
- Know how to get on to a website about a topic and record relevant information.

- Know what search engines are and how to use several search engines.
- Know how to get on to some reliable websites and use these websites to find out

- Know several different search engines and be able to navigate them effectively for the purposes of research.
- Be able to identify reliable sources of information online

They will be able to identify which websites are reliable. They will know most of the SMART rules and be able to use the internet safely converting information they have found into their own words.
