

Improving the Physical and Mental Health of People with a Learning Disability


Focus Group Information Sheet



People with a learning disability experience poorer health than people without a learning disability.



One reason for this is that it can be harder for people with a learning disability to access healthcare services.



We have been asked by NHS England and Improvement to help them understand how to improve healthcare services for people with a learning disability and or autism.





In this research project, we will try to find out:

- Why people with a learning disability have poorer health?
- Why it can be harder for people with a learning disability to access healthcare services?
- What services can do to improve the health and experiences of people with a learning disability?



We will learn this by speaking with people with a learning disability and their carers.

We will also collect information from healthcare services and healthcare professionals.



Our project will also try to understand why autistic people experience poorer health.

We will speak with autistic people and the people who support them too.

Why am I being contacted?



We want to work together with people with a learning disability to help us make the recommendations that will make the most difference to them and their health.

What am I being invited to do?



We are inviting you to an online meeting with other people with a learning disability to talk about what matters to your health and wellbeing.

We will ask about your ideas for improving health services for people with a learning disability.

It is a chance for you to tell us what you think.

There are no right or wrong answers.

Time: 10 am to 12 pm with breaks



Where: Online, using Microsoft Teams



We will send you the questions before the meeting so that you will know what we are going to ask you.



If you are not a member of NHS staff, we will send you a voucher for £50 after the meeting to thank you for your time.



The meeting has been organised by an organisation called <u>The Strategy Unit</u>.

The Strategy Unit is part of the NHS and its job is to help NHS services to learn and improve.

We will work together with other people to run the focus group.

Jodie is a Learning Disability and Autism Network Manager at NHS England and Improvement.



Fiona Ritchie

Fiona works with people with a learning disability to help their voices to be heard.



Ellie Moore

Ellie is a researcher from the Strategy Unit.



Other people with a learning disability will also be sharing their views.

What we will do with the information



Before the meeting we will check that you and the other group members are happy to have the discussion recorded.



We will record the discussion to help us remember what you have said.




The recording will be kept in a safe place.

We will use what we have learned from the discussion to make recommendations to the NHS about how to improve health services for people with a learning disability.


