Buddhism

Learning Intention: Students are given an overview of the ideas of the Buddhist beliefs in God, the Buddhist teachings, festivals and celebrations and their place of worship. Students will be given the opportunity to compare their studies of Buddhism alongside their own beliefs, experiences and knowledge. Students are encouraged to explore where Buddhism fits within our shared cultures, countries of origin and communities.

Concept:	Buddhism is a major world faith, students will be introduced to the Siddhartha Gautama – the Buddha's life and that he was a wise person, not a god. The topic will look at stories of the Buddha, a human prince who lived in northern India a long time ago, who gave up wealth and status to achieve understanding of human experience and enlightenment. Students will also gain an understanding of the Buddhist place of worship and gain a knowledge of a Buddhist festival and celebration which can be understood and shared within our different communities and cultures.
